9th Annual Maryland Duck & Goose Hunt

January 13–16 Easton, MD





The community of Easton, Maryland proudly welcomed six of our Heroes for the 9th Annual MD Duck and Goose Hunt. This stellar event featured world-class goose, duck and pheasant hunting and was the ideal environment to relax and restore for a few days. Upon arrival, our Heroes enjoyed skeet shooting at the [Talbot Rod & Gun Club](#) in preparation for their weekend hunts. They were also graciously provided with beautiful duck and goose calls courtesy of [Sean Mann](#) and were trained on how to use them. Later, our Heroes had a delicious dinner at the [Tidewater Inn](#) while getting better acquainted and discussing plans for the next morning's hunt.

Everyone rose early the next day, grabbed a quick breakfast and then headed to a blind on the [Choptank River](#) to start their hunt. They harvested 2 bufflehead hens. After the water blind hunt, all Heroes and Guides headed to the field to hunt Canada Goose. It was a fantastic time as a total of 15 geese were harvested. After an exciting day in the field, everyone enjoyed dinner and live music while talking about their exceptional day.

The next day, everyone had a chance to sleep in as they had scheduled a hunt later in the afternoon for pheasant and chukar. Our Heroes cleaned and prepped all their geese from the previous day, had a good lunch, then drove to the [Caroline County Shooting Preserve](#) to hunt pheasant with Springer Spaniels. They harvested just under 20 birds, then headed back to the hotel to get cleaned up and rest a bit before dinner. A wonderful final night's dinner was held at [Chesapeake Landing](#) with great food, conversation, and plenty of laughs amongst the Heroes as they reminisced about what an incredible time they had in Maryland over the past few days.

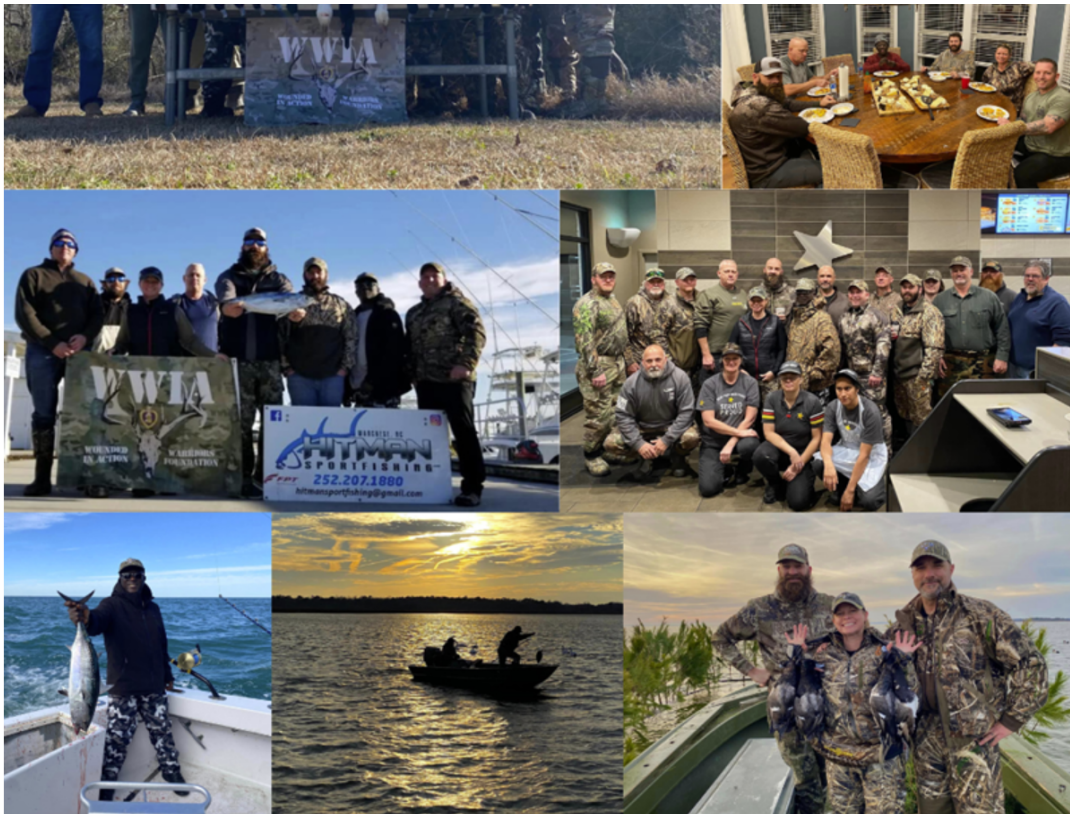

Everyone woke early on Saturday for a quick breakfast before heading to their designated hunting sites. It was another successful day hunting with many deer seen throughout the morning and a few more harvested by our Heroes. The deer were taken to the processor, then everyone gathered at the quail preserve and had a delicious lunch of fried chicken, fried catfish, various sides, and bread pudding, courtesy of the local [Stage Coach Restaurant](#).
