


NOTES FROM THE FIELD: Summer 2023



10th Annual Alaska Halibut Fishing

June 4-8 Seward, AK



The 10th Annual Alaska Halibut Fishing event celebrated a decade of honoring and serving our combat-wounded Heroes in one of the most majestic and beautiful environments on earth. Everyone arrived in Seward and got situated for their stay at the <u>Kenai Fjords Bed and Breakfast</u>.

The first evening in Alaska was outstanding as everyone enjoyed getting to know one another while dining on a scrumptious dinner of halibut with sweet Thai chili sauce, adorned with peppers and onions over rice, along with green chimichurri halibut over rice with fresh asparagus on the side. Later, there was time for some sightseeing in downtown Seward before relaxing and sharing some stories and laughs.

The next morning, a delicious meal of biscuits and gravy was served, and then the crew headed out for a relaxing hike to the Exit Glacier. The moose were

also out and about in Seward and what a sight they were! Later that afternoon, everyone got geared up and were given expert instruction and guidance as they went snagging for salmon at the head of the bay, in Resurrection Creek, courtesy of Rick Brown and Adventure Sixty North. This was a unique experience as none of the Heroes had ever done any snagging and it was an absolute blast! A wonderful dinner was shared at the local American Legion Post 5 and then a quick nap was had by all before waking up for some late salmon snagging again from midnight to 3am. This day was packed full of fun and adventure, just as you would expect in the Alaskan wilderness!

After a breakfast of fresh blueberry pancakes, it was time to drop some lines in search of grey cod, halibut, and more rock fish. There was a plethora of wildlife sightings again and in addition to the Humpback whales and sea lions, there were killer whales around as well. It was quick work on the water as our Heroes started their morning limiting out on rockfish, then headed over to the Aialik Glacier to take in the breathtaking sights and enjoy a "glacierita" made with ice from the glacier. What a cool experience! After that, it was time to fish again, with a combination of cod and halibut caught. There was plenty of wildlife to see once again. Humpback whales, orcas, mountain goats, and otters were plentiful and an amazing sight to see. Heroes returned after a long day on the water and feasted on fish tacos with some of the rockfish they had caught that day along with cilantro lime pico de gallo, cilantro rice, and a phenomenal fruit and vegetable mango lime chutney.

The last day of the event began with a wonderful breakfast and send off from our Host before taking in a visit at the <u>Alaska Sealife Center</u>, learning about the local marine life as well as the ecosystem of Alaska. Heroes then made their way to the <u>Elmendorf-Richardson Joint Military Base</u> in Anchorage for a quick tour. A final meal was enjoyed at the <u>Moose Tooth Pub and Pizzeria</u> as everyone feasted on pizza and reminisced about an incredible 5 days spent in Alaska.

This trip truly checked off all the boxes as it offered ample relaxation, epic fishing, outstanding camaraderie, wonderful hospitality and food, and one of the most remarkable backdrops in the world! These experiences will stay in the hearts and minds of our Heroes for many years to come as they marveled at scenic vistas, observed native wildlife, learned about local history, and indulged in world-class fishing in the last great wilderness. Our Heroes could not be more grateful for their time spent in Alaska. 





Summer Supporter Spotlight

SUPPORTER SPOTLIGHT



We are honored to introduce you to an outstanding friend and supporter of the Foundation, Mr. Steve Kostbade. Steve has been an ardent advocate and a generous supporter of WWIA over the past few years, joining us in our mission to bring healing and restoration to our Purple Heart Heroes. We appreciate Steve and are proud to share a bit about him and his journey with WWIA.

Steve, can you tell us a bit about yourself, please?

I am 69 years old. My wife, partner, and best friend have been blessed with four children, three daughters, and one son. We also have eight wonderful grandchildren. My wife retired two years ago and I retired seven years ago. I

love to spend time hunting, fishing, playing golf, and enjoying the beach at our second home in beautiful Clearwater Beach, Florida. When we are not at the beach, we reside at our home in southern Indiana, enjoying time with our kids, grandkids and friends.

Can you please tell us how you first became involved with the Wounded Warriors in Action Foundation (WWIA)?

I first became involved with the WWIA in the summer of 2019 at the Heartland Bowhunter Premier in Kansas City, Missouri. I bought a bow at the Premier auction. This particular bow was used by Skylar Wirsig to harvest his huge 8-point buck at Travis Milne's farm in Missouri. Travis was at the Premier and I got to meet and talk with him and he shared a great deal about WWIA with me. Since then, I have bought a couple of other bows at subsequent Heartland Bowhunter Premiers with proceeds going to the WWIA. I have become an avid supporter of WWIA and also follow them on social media.

Can you tell us about your journey as an outdoor sportsman? How has being in the great outdoors benefitted you throughout your life?

I started hunting and fishing at a very early age. I always hunted with my dad, mainly for small game, until I started and fell in love with deer hunting around the age of 16. Since then, I have hunted most of the big game in the U.S. with the exception of sheep and goats. I have been fortunate to kill Whitetail, Mule Deer, Black Bear, Grizzly Bear, Fallow Deer, Red Stag, all 4 species of Wild Turkey, Audad Sheep, Mountain Lion, Alaska Yukon Moose, Antelope and predator's. I have hunted in New Zealand, South Africa, Botswana, Zimbabwe, Mozambique, Namibia and 3 Provinces in Canada, I have killed most of the plains game in Africa and as far as dangerous game, I have killed Crocodile and Leopard. I have been able to visit and hunt many places in the world. I have seen how fortunate I am to live, eat, and enjoy life by going to so many far away places. Sleeping out in the mountains seeing all of the stars at night, seeing the northern lights, enjoying the peace and quite and the sounds in the outdoors. I have meet so many people from different cultures and places that I have been able to visit and I would not trade that for anything. I hope I still have quite a few more hunts and trips in the future.

You have been a tremendous supporter of the Foundation through the Heartland Bowhunter Premiere charity auction. Can you explain to everyone why you choose to graciously support WWIA and our combatwounded Purple Heart Heroes?

I started following the WWIA through the Heartland Bowhunter Premier's and my buddies at Heartland Bowhunter. I feel blessed that I am able to give this organization my support. I have heard some of the veterans stories and I am so grateful for what these men and women do and have done to keep my family and I along with all of the people in the U.S. safe and free. The more I see people and athletes disrespect the flag, the national anthem and our country, the more I want to support our vets and the WWIA. I considerate an honor to support all of our veterans both past and present and will continue to support the WWIA for the rest of my life.

What would you say to others who are considering getting involved with WWIA either as a Supporter or perhaps in some other capacity?

It is impossible to support all of the charities that exist, but if a person was debating which ones to support, I would say to them, support the ones that are dear to your heart. The organizations that hit home, the organizations that effect us the most. Certainly consider WWIA. Look at what these brave men and women have given to us. They have given us freedom, safety, and they stand up and defend our rights. These men and women have lost limbs, and suffered so much from what they have seen and had to do on our behalf. They deserve our help. How can you look at any veteran, some that are homeless.




